- He had a residence from 1663 to 1720 in Washington Parish, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
- Inheritance Fact: Daniel is listed in his father, Abraham's will, 26 August 1674, Westmoreland County, Virginia. -Aug. 26, 1674. Daniel is listed in father, Abram Feild's will written 16 June 1674. He is willed a heifer and equal division of Abram's "prsonall estate be sold at an outcry for the best advantage of my five children...
- He worked as a Planter from about 1680 to 1720 in Westmoreland County, Virginia.
- Arrested: Daniel Field arrested., 29 January 1690/91, Westmoreland County, Virginia. -Jan. 29, 1690-1691. Henry Hawes caused Daniel Feild to be arrested, and for that he filed no decleration, Feild prayed a nonsuite.
- Court Record: 25 February 1690/91, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Pg. 14. Feb. 25, 1690/1691. Daniel Feild vs. Francis Williams. Per 2000 pounds of tobacco per contract. Dismist.
- Court Record: 26 February 1690/91, Westmoreland County, Virginia. -Feb. 26, 1690-1691. Attachment is granted Mr. Robt. Brent against Daniel Feild's estate for that he did not appeare to answer suite, the Sheriff haveing made oath that he left a copy of his writt at the defendant's house.

Robert Brent (1660-1695/96) was the son of George Brent and Marianna Peyton and was the 8th great-grand uncle of Lucie C. Field on her mother's side.
- Court Record: Did not appear in court, 25 June 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "John Minor vs. Danll. Feild. Per 260 pounds of tobacco. Order against the Sheriff. Attachment is granted the Sheriff against Danll. Feild for that he did not appeare to answer the suite."
- Court Record: Suite dismissed, 25 June 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Robt. Brent vs. Danll. Feild. Declaration per 450 pounds of tobacco." Dismist.
- Court Record: Judgement against the estate of Daniel Field, 29 July 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. A judgement was granted against the estate of Daniel Field for 260 pounds of tobacco to pay John Minor.
- Court Record: did not appear in court, 1 October 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Mrs Elizabeth Lord vs. Daniel Field. Daniel did not appear, attachment granted to his estate.
- Court Record: judgement against Daniel Field, 1 October 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. An earlier dispute between Edward Mountjoy and Daniel Field over a horse is decided by the court. Edward's brother Thomas was ordered to keep the horse.
- Land Deed: 23 November 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Daniel Field of Westmoreland County, planter, to Tobias Butler, planter of same. For a valuable consideration.

One half a the tract of land belonging to the said Daniel Field and Abraham his brother, left jointly to them by Abraham Field their father, since divided by the two brothers, being that which Daniel Field liveth upon.

Daniel Field do bind himself in the forfeiture of 1500 pounds of tobacco unto Tobias Butler, peacefully to enjoy it without any trouble from the claims of any person.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: judgement against Daniel Field, 25 November 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Daniel Field promises to pay Elizabeth Lord 400 pounds of tobacco.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: did not appear in court, 26 November 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Daniel Field's estate attached when he did not appear to answer the suite lodged against him by Henry Haines.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: wife, Mary Field, acknowledges land transaction, 29 November 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Mary Field acknowledges the transaction to Tobias Butler.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: suite withdrawn, 29 December 1691, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Henry Hawes [Haines?] withdrew his action vs. Danll Feild."
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jury Member: 25 March 1692, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Lawrence Abbington was arrested to answer Alexndr. Gordon in a plea." Abbington's attorney was Robert Brent.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: surveyed land, 28 September 1692, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Liberty is granted to Daniel Field to survey land.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Land Transaction: Daniel Field deeds land to Tobias Butler, 29 November 1693, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: Daniel Field has William Scott arrested, 28 February 1693/94, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Daniel Field had William Scott Arrested for a debt of 250 pounds of tobacco but failed to prosecute. <p>The date on the court record reads 29 Feb. 1693/94. But there was no 29 Feb. that year.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: suite against Daniel Field by Dr. Edward Maddocks, 27 June 1695, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Suite lodged against Daniel by the executors of the will of Dr. Edward Maddocks for debt of 900 pounds of tobacco. Daniel said he had paid the debt and Tobias Butler was his witness. Daniel won the case and was ordered to pay Tobias Butler.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: Daniel Field and Tobias Butler sold the estate of Humphrey Pope, 25 March 1696, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Daniel Field and Tobias Butler received most of the estate of Humphrey Pope as payment for debt from Patrick Muckleroy, which they then sold. Muckleroy came into possession by marrying the relict (widow) of Humphrey Pope. William Paine, husband of a daughter of Humphrey Pope, petitioned the court on behalf of his wife and her siblings for compensation from the estate of thier father. Field and Butler presented evidence to the court of their claim against the estate of Humphrey. The court turned over the documents to William Paine who then decided on behalf of the children of Humphrey Pope to accept 70 pounds of tobacco from Field and Butler.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: Abraham Field, brother of Daniel, appointed attorney for Daniel, 12 June 1696, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Appointed attorney by his brother Abraham to acknowledge a land transaction.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Order: sued Richard Dudley, 27 August 1696, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Daniel sued Richard Dudley for a mare that Dudley had promised him. He was awarded the mare and her colt.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: suite over non payment for lumber, 27 January 1696/97, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Daniel involved in a suit against William Fitzhugh over non payment for lumber. Daniel was awarded the judgement, however, Fitzhugh appealed.

•	Court Record: John Elliott sued Daniel Field, 26 May 1697, Westmoreland County, Virginia. John Elliott sued Daniel Field. The Sheriff failed to arrest Daniel and an attachment was granted against the estate of Daniel.
•	Court Record: Daniel Field ordered to pay John Minor 500 pounds of tobacco, 25 November 1697, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
•	Court Record: Daniel Field ordered to pay John Elliott 693 pounds of tobacco, 24 February 1697/98, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
•	Court Record: Estate appraiser for Tobias Butler, 1 December 1698, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "It is also ordered that Danll. Field, Hump: Pope, Elias Morris and Wm. Ramy appraise the estate."
•	Court Record: Ordered that he be summoned to report on an estate appraisal for James Banks., 30 August 1699, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
•	Arrested: 31 August 1699, Westmoreland County, Virginia. A nonsuit granted after Richard Hill failed to prosecute his case against Daniel Field for a debt owed. Hill had earlier caused Daniel to be arrested.
•	Court Record: failed to appear in court, 30 November 1699, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Estate attached by Sheriff (for 600 pounds of tobacco) because he failed to appear in court. He was being sued for a debt owed. (600 pounds of tobacco)
•	Land Deed: Mentioned in land deed between John Pratt and his goddaught Mary Liley, 29 September 1702, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
•	Court Record: appointed security for the Wheeler orphans' estate, 26 November 1702, Westmoreland County, Virginia. On 26 November 1702 John Jones showing that he became security with Evan Price who m. the relict of Edward Wheeler for her due admin. on Wheeler's estate, which Price afterwards m. Wheeler's widow and thereby became possessed of Wheeler's estate, and Price being also since dead, Danll. Feild of this co. hath m. the widow, and further setting forth that the estate passing through so many hands, tis more than probable may be embezelled and that Jones is not of ability to answer the same to Wheeler's orphants, humbly praying that Feild might give security for the orphants' estates and that Jones be discharged of the same.
•	Court Record: Daniel ordered to prove the Wheeler estate not embezzeled., 26 November 1702, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "John Jones showing that hee became security with Evan Price who married the relict of Edward Wheeler for her due administration on Wheeler's estate, which Price afterwards intermarried with Wheeler's widdow and thereby became possessed of Wheeler's esate, and Price being also since dead, Danll. Feild of this County hath intermarried the widdow, by virtue whereof hee is become possessed of Wheeler's estate, and further setting forth that the estate passing through so many hands, 'tis more than probably may be imbezelled and that Jones is not of ability to answer the same to Wheeler's orphants, humbly praying that Feild might give security for the orphants' estates and that hee might bee discharged of the same, it is ordered that Danll. Feild bee summoned to answer."
•	Court Record: Daniel ordered to prove the Wheeler estate not embezzeled continued, 30 December 1702, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "By virtue of November Court last, it was required the Sheriff should summon Danll. Feild who hath intermarried with Mary the relict of Evan Price who was the relict and executrix of Edwd. Wheeler to answer such matters as should bee objected on behalf of the orphants of Wheeler. The same not being performed, the order is continued."
•	Named Trustee: Named trustee for William Bennetts minor son Cosscomb Bennett., 2 February 1702/03, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "My friend Daniel Field my trustee for the good of my son to advise and instruct him in the management of his estate." Daniel served as witness and proved the will.
•	Court Record: Daniel Field appointed trustee of Cossum Bennett until he is of majority, 31 March 1703, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "The last will and testament of William Bennett was proved by Danll. Feild, John Lilly and Garrat Welch at a Court held 24 February 1702 [1703] by which hee constituted his son Cossum Bennett his sole executor and to bee at age at the hour of his death and Daniel Feild his trustee for the good of his son and to advise and instruct him in the management of his estate that hee should not make away with it, but for that it appeared the estate of the testator to bee very considerable and the executor nigh of age and Danll. Feild praying a probat of the will, it was ordered the Sheriff should summon Dorothy Bennett, relict of the testator to declare the majority of Cossum. At this court it fully appeared under the hand and seal of Dorothy that shee has for valuable considerations relinquished all manner of claim or title to the estate. Upon further motion of Danll. Feild, administration is granted to him dureing the infancy of Cossum Bennett, executor in the will named. It is also ordered that John Pratt junr., Joshua Hudson, Wm. Rush and John Lilly appraise the estate."
•	Court Record: Daniel Field asked to pay out of William Bennett's estate, 30 September 1703, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Judgement is granted Lydia Hilliard against Danll. Feild as trustee to the estate of Wm. Bennett for 480 pounds

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jury Member: Jury foreman, 30 December 1703, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: 31 December 1703, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "In the action of case brought by Mr. George Nicholson against Danll. Feild trustee to the estate of Wm. Bennett deceased, the defendant pleads hee is administrator and not trustee. A nonsuite is granted."
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: 31 December 1703, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Daniel Feild administrator of William Bennett brought his action against George Nicholson for 540 pounds of tobacco. The defendant pleaded a discharge in barr of the plaintiff's action and produceing the same, the court doth dismiss the suite."
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: 31 December 1703, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Upon the petition of Christopher Thomas, son-in-law to Wm. Bennett, ordered that Daniel Field administrator of Wm. Bennett deliver unto Christopher Thomas one mare, one chest, one gun, the fourth part of his cropp of tobacco hanging at his death after his debts paid, being what was given to Christopher Thomas by Wm. Bennett by his last will and testament. Danll. Field administrator of Wm. Bennett, confessed judgement to John Higdon as marrying the daughter of Wm. Bennett for four head of cattle due to him by the last will and testament of Wm. Bennett."
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: 23 February 1703/04, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Cossum Bennett petitioned that Daniel Field be discharged as administrator of the estate of William Bennett. Cossum has reached the age of majority.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Land Record: 21 March 1703/04, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Daniel Field bought land from William Balthrop of Stafford County for 9000 pounds of tobacco. "783 acres in Washington Parish, bounded north with beaver dams of Attopen Creek, south with Nanzattico path...formerly granted unto Capt. John Ashton 15 9br[Nov.] 1664 and by Ashton sold to Stephen Howard 7 Oct. 1667 and by Stephen Howard sold unto Wm. Balthorp, father of the said William..."
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: 26 July 1704, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "The last will and testament of Joshua Hudson was proved by all the witnesses thereto and a probat granted Elizabeth his relict and one of the executors in the will named, Joshua Hudson, the other executor in open Court relinquishing his right of executorshipp. Ordered that Elizabeth return a full and perfect inventory and it is ordered that Danll. Field, John Pratt, Jno: Lilly and John Jones appraise the same."

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrested: 27 July 1704, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Alexr. Spence Gent. caused Danll. Field to bee arrested to answer him in a plea on the case, upon which the Sheriff returned cepi corpus, but for that hee failed to have Field to answer the same, order passed against the Sheriff and attachment thereon was granted him."
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrested: Fined for refusing to be juror, 29 August 1705, Westmoreland County, Virginia. "Christopher Butler and Daniel Feild being summoned by the Sheriff to attend the Court as jurors for the day for that they refused and neglected to appear and bee sworn to do thier dutes but contemptuously departed are each of them fined."
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fined: Fined for refusing to take the oath., 27 March 1706, Westmoreland County, Virginia.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: 19 March 1706/07, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Witnessed land deed of Jane Thornton to Francis Thornton.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court Record: Margaret Ashton gave her brother Daniel attorney over her deseased husband's estate, 22 January 1707/08, Westmoreland County, Virginia. Page 165. 22 Jan. 1708 [1709]. I have come to an agreement and received satisfaction for my deceased husband Charles Ashton's estate of his sons Burditt and Charles. These impower my loving brother Danl. Field to appear for me and acknowledge the same as also my right of dower to his lands. Margarette Ashton Wit: W. Robinson 26 Jan. 1708 [1709]. Acknowledged by Danl. Field

Daniel Field turned over land to Henry and John Wheeler which their father, Edward Wheeler, had left them in his will. Edward Wheeler was the second husband of Mary Alday. The two Wheeler brothers must have reached majority, thus giving them the full right to the land.

Item I give and bequeath to my eldest son Dan Field all his holy living wherein he now lives within and without and all the land belongeth to me about Popes Creek to him and his heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Joyce Hudson one negro named Jey & 3 plantacons the Taylor Wilkersons and John Edwards to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Henry Field a large still and copper with the worm & materials belonging to it One large brrass kettle a spitt & a iron pottrack being at my lower plantacon in Stafford County going by the name of William Ports to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Abraham Field the plantacon called Simeon Luckens & all the lower part of the land joyning to the lower branch near the plantacon called Taylors Wilkinson to him and his heirs forever Item I give to my son Henry One little plantacon containing 50 acres which Charles Ricklings lives on to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my sons Abraham and Henry all my other estate in the fork of the Rappahannock river in what manner of Kind soever & four negroes Will, Geb, Sam and Peter; one white servant called Catrine Simons as for my personal estate at my lower houses One half to be conducted into this and the other to Evan Price.
