






<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Marriage Announcement: 1875, Steelman Settlement, Gibson County, Indiana. The neighborhood of the Steelman Settlement was the seat of quite a pleasant affair last week -- a double wedding: Mr. John Steelman led Miss Mina A. Knaub, and George Field led Miss Sallie J. Knaub to the hymenal alter. We wish them happiness and sucess through life.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Marriage Application: Marriage license to Geo. W. Field and Sallie J. Knaub announced in Hazleton paper., September 1875, Hazleton, Gibson County, Indiana.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1880 Census: Son in the household of Benjamin Fields, 30, born Indiana, farming, 1880, White River Twp., Gibson County, Indiana.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Buggy Mishap: Hazleton, Gibson County, Indiana. While Geo. E. Field and his lady were stopping at a neighbors, on the way home from Princeton Suda evening, the horse ran away with the buggy, completely demolishing it, so far as usefulness is concerned.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Marriage Application: Marriage license issuance to Geo. W. Field and Lavica Hinkle announced in local Hazleton, Indiana newspaper, 19 January 1881, Gibson County, Indiana.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Robbed by Jesse James: 5 September 1881. George was on a train excursion from Rochester, New York to Kansas City, when Jesse James and his gang robbed the train. This fact is noted in Lavica Hinkle Field's scrapbook next to an article from <i>The Guide</i> noting James' death and the incident on the excursion. The article noted that they were going to present a picture of Jesse James to all those who had been on the train.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Land Ownership: Section 1, 1881, White River Twp. Gibson County, Indiana.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He immigrated in 1882 to Porter County, Indiana.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He had a residence before 1890 in Burdick, Porter County, Indiana. George and Lavica probably lived here before moving to Valparaiso. In a letter from Howard Field to Marjorie Field Holt, he states, "When we were young we would go to Burdick (east of Chesterton) every fall to get walnuts and hickory nuts. I always had an impression that at some time the George Field tribe had lived there. When we would go, Dad always spoke of it as home, perhaps the house had burned, as there was none there."</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He worked as a school teacher before 1890.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He resided at 9 La Porte Ave. in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana between 1890 and 1893.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He worked as a carpenter from 1890 to 1893 in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He resided at 11 La Porte Ave. in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana in 1893.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He worked as a carpenter and florist in 1893 in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana. Kathryn Field Runnion mentions in a letter to her cousin Virginia Field Williams that Lavica Field had a greenhouse. This may have been at this time, when George is listed as florist.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He had a residence between 1897 and 1898 in Otis, Porter County, Indiana.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He resided at 69 Oak Street, Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana from 1898 to 1902.</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• He worked as a carpenter, builder, contractor from 1898 to 1902 in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana. According to his obituary "he followed his trade as a carpenter in this city [Valparaiso] until 13 years ago [1902], when he established a printing office, doing all kinds of printing and bookbinding. This he maintained until he was forced by sickness to close his shop."</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• He resided at Jefferson St. in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana. The date of this residence is unknown. It would have been prior to his living at 1001 Oak St.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• He resided at 1001 East Oak Street, Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana from about 1905 to 1915. George bought this property on 5 April 1898. This house is next door to John and Jenny Hinkle's house (Lavica Hinkle's brother) and the two houses are mirror images of each other. According to a letter from his granddaughter Kathryn Field Runnion, George built this house: "Marge [another granddaughter, Marjorie Field Holt] knew of two more residences of George E. and Lavica probably before he built." Presumably the Hinkles also built their house at the same time. George was a carpenter until 1905 and was also listed as a builder and contractor in the 1902 city directory. It is highly likely that he was building both his own home and the Hinkle house at this time.</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• He worked as a printer, book and job and general book binder from 1905 to 1915 in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana. According to his obituary "he followed his trade as a carpenter in this city [Valparaiso] until 13 years ago [1902], when he established a printing office, doing all kinds of printing and bookbinding. This he maintained until he was forced by sickness to close his shop." It also stated "he continued to work at the trade of printing until several months ago...[1915]"</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• His obituary was published on 17 July 1915 in Valparaiso, Porter County, Indiana. <b>GEO. FIELD ANSWERS TO THE CALL OF DEATH</b>  <b>One of Valparaiso's Well Known Citizens passes to the Beyond this Morning after Lingering Illness. FUNERAL MONDAY A.M.</b>  Geo. E. Field, a well known and highly esteemed resident of this city, died this morning at 7 o'clock at his home, 1001 Oak street. He had been in a precarious condition for some time and his death was not unexpected. Mr. Field suffered an illness about a year ago from leakage of the heart. He continued to work at his trade of printing until several months ago, when his condition became critical and he was forced to take to his bed. Bright's disease developed and he became so ill that no hopes were held out for his ultimate recovery.  The deceased was born in Gibson County, Indiana, near Hazleton, on December 23, 1849. When a young man he acquired the rudiments of the printing trade and followed this for a number of years. He also taught school and then worked at the trade of carpenter until he became a contractor. This and the occupation of printer he followed the rest of his life.</li> </ul>

## Events (cont.)

On September 15, 1875, he was united in marriage to Miss Sarah Knaub, who died on October 19, 1876. To this union one son, Wilbur Wallace, who died at the age of 2. On January 19, 1881, he was married to Miss Lavica Hinkle, who survives him together with five children-Clarence, Walter, Harvey, and Nelson Field of this city, and Elmer Field of Chicago. A daughter, Mary Ellen, died at the age of eight years. One brother Cain R. Field, of Patoka, Ind., also survives.

Mr. Field came to Valparaiso in 1882, and lived continuously in this city and county. He followed his trade as a carpenter in this city until thirteen years ago, when he established a printing office, doing all kinds of printing and bookbinding. This he maintained until he was forced by sickness to close his shop.

He was a member of the Methodist Church, joining when a young boy, and he was ever willing to lend a hand to its affairs. He held many offices in the church and was always looked upon as one of its leading workers.

The funeral services will be held Monday morning at 10 o'clock from the late home, 1001 Oak street. Rev. C. A. Brooke will be in charge. Interment will be at Maplewood cemetery.
