

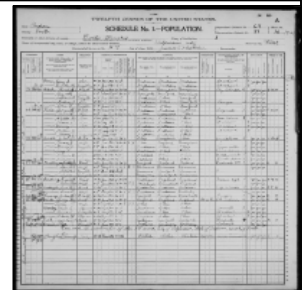

He is survived by Mrs. Field, and by sons, Leslie of Marion, Howard of Fresno Calif., Glen, Syracuse and daughters, Mrs. Jacob Williams, Chesterton, Mrs. Merle Clouse, Nappanee, and Mrs. Darwin Winger, Elkhart. He is also survived by a brother, Nelson, Valparaiso.

The funeral will be conducted by Rev. Thrasher, assisted by Rev. Robert Wagner, at the Wright-Yoder Funeral Home Thursday (today) at 2:30. Burial will be at Violet Cemetery near Waterford.

Mr. Field published the Advance-News from 1927 to 1954. His paper was instrumental in promoting the Indiana Muck Crop Association and in promoting roads in Indiana, primarily Route 6.

He was a member of the Methodist Church, of Nappanee F&AM and of Kiwanis.

Harvey O. Field, Nappanee, former resident of Valparaiso, died at 4:30 a.m. this morning in Elkhart hospital, Elkhart.

Born May 27, 1889 in Valparaiso he was the son of Mr. and Mrs. George Field. On June 17, 1909 in Valparaiso he married Marie Jeanette Eddy, who survives.

He was formerly employed by the Daily Vidette and also by the Evening Messenger before the two companies merged in 1927, at which time he moved to Nappanee. He was owner and publisher of the Nappanee Advanced News until his retirement in 1954.

Surviving besides the widow are three sons Leslie, Marion, Ind., Howard, Fresno, Calif., and Glen, Syracuse, Ind.; three daughters Myrtle Williams, Chesterton, Rae Ellen Wenger, Elkhart, and Mary Clouse, Nappanee; one brother Nelson of Valparaiso.

Services will be held Thursday at 2:30 p.m. EST in Yoder Wright Funeral home, Nappanee. Burial will be in Violet cemetery, Goshen, Ind.

NAPPANEE-The former editor and publisher of the Nappanee Advance-News from 1927-54, Harvey O. Field, 76, of 805 W. Market, died this morning in Elkhart General Hospital. He had been there one day following a brief illness.

A member of the Nappanee Methodist Church, Mr. Field also belonged to Kiwanis Club and Masons, both of Nappanee.

During his life, he helped Purdue University establish the former Indiana Muck Crop Show.

Born on May 27, 1889, in Valparaiso, Mr. Field married Marie J. Eddie June 17, 1909.

Surviving are his wife; three sons, Leslie of Marion, Howard of Fresno, Calif., and Glenn of Syracuse; three daughters, Mrs. Jacob Williams of Chesterton, Ind., Mrs. Darwin Weienger, of Elkhart, and Mrs. Merle Clouse of Nappanee; a brother, Nelson Field of Valparaiso; 16 grand-children, and seven great-grand-children.
