

Descendants of Daniel Field

Generation No. 1

1. Daniel⁴ Field (Henry³, Daniel*², Abraham*¹)^{1,2,3,4}. He married Anne Roberts^{5,6,7,8}, daughter of Benjamin Roberts and Ann Field. She was born in Culpeper County, Virginia⁹, and died ⁹.

Notes for Daniel Field:

At this time we do not have conclusive evidence to link, first Anne Roberts to Daniel Field and two Joseph Field (the last son) to these parents. We do however have some circumstantial evidence which is listed below.

According to many Culpeper County deeds, Anne Roberts, daughter of Benjamin Roberts (1707-1782) was married to a Daniel Field. Many secondary sources (Vallentine, John Frankin. The Roberts-Orme Ancestry, Vol. I, Dunedin, New Zealand: John D. Roberts, 1994. McAllister, Edward N. and Annabelle C. McAllister, Estes Genealogy: Estes Families of old Clay County, Missouri. Their Ancestors and Descendants., 1972) state that Daniel Field, husband of Anne Roberts, was the son of Capt. Abraham Field. We have proven this to be incorrect (See notes for Daniel Field son of Abraham of Culpeper.)

In Emma Mastin Walker's letter (1998) listing the burials in the Old Field Cemetery she states that, "according to family tradition her ancestor Daniel Field married Hannah Roberts." She also states the original church records were, " burned by the Yankees during the Civil War," records which might have clarified these relationships.

The Old Field Cemetery is on land which was owned by brothers Capt. Henry Field, Sr. and Daniel Field. Daniel never left Westmoreland County. Capt. Henry had a son named Daniel. This Daniel was about the same age as his first cousin, Daniel, son of Capt. Abraham Field. This Daniel married a Sarah. Because of the above facts, and to our knowledge there are no other Daniel Fields of the appropriate age, we have placed Anne Roberts as the wife of Daniel Field, son of Capt. Henry Field. Although Emma's letter names Daniel's wife to be Hannah the fact that she uses the last name Roberts is important. Benjamin Robert's daughter Hannah married William Field, son of Capt. Abraham.
